For example, a recent study by Danish author Bjorn Lomborg analyzes the real costs of the policies sought to impose the Paris Agreement on climate change, which if fully implemented would cost about \$2 trillion by 2030. This alone would reduce emissions. 1% of what is necessary to limit the average increase in global temperature to 1.5°C. "Every dollar spent in Paris will produce climate benefits worth 11¢," says Lomborg, who believes

that it is much more coherent to invest that money in science and technology to accelerate the energy transformation, as well as in mitigation.

But the second serious issue is the use of fear that many politicians are doing to achieve an end that they have always sought: directing people's lives down to the smallest detail.

You should not travel by car, much less by plane. Eat meat? Heresy! Tourism is a criminal act, the same as having children. And they even want to convince us that the gases from our cows are more dangerous than the mega factories of China. Worst? When they say that "we must save the planet." Gentlemen, for the planet we are a speck of dust! It existed thousands of years before we appeared, and it will continue when we are fossils. And we couldn't care less, as he reveals every so often with an earthquake that kills thousands. The ones who have to save ourselves are us.

This is where covid comes in. There is a disastrous consensus among many technicians and politicians that the end justifies the means. And that it is worth manipulating figures, making exaggerated predictions, to "generate awareness." Disregarding people's intelligence and promoting the pendulum effect.
